Southern Delivery System Explained on Web Website Now On-Line

Loveland: Information on the Southern Delivery System and its environmental review is available on-line. Those interested in the Environmental Impact Study for the proposed water project can now attain additional information from the World Wide Web.

The address is simple: www.sdseis.com.

Internet users can access the website directly by typing in the address on the “address line” of their Internet search program. Or, web surfers can link to the website after visiting related pages on the Colorado Springs Utilities website at www.csu.org or from the Bureau of Reclamation’s Great Plains Regional website at www.usbr.gov/gp/index.cfm (go to Environmental Activities).

The Southern Delivery System is a water delivery system proposed by Colorado Springs Utilities. Because the pipeline would link to the federal Fryingpan-Arkansas Project, the Bureau of Reclamation must review and approve it. Reclamation’s review is in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act.

The Website is part of the public information program under Reclamation’s Environmental Impact Study. It features background information on the proposed project and the eight different alternatives currently being considered. It also contains information explaining how the project would work and explaining the Environmental Impact Study process.
